

Associate Professor Gail Mason is Co-Director of the Sydney Institute of Criminology, Faculty of Law, University of Sydney. Prior to this she taught in Gender Studies at the University of Sydney and Criminology at Victoria University of Wellington, New Zealand. Professor Mason's research revolves around the issues of hate crime and discrimination. She is especially interested in the ways in which legal and social discourse constitute our understandings of what it means to 'hate' others. Gail is currently involved in several research projects, including an international comparison of hate crime law, a critique of the role of emotion in the construction and definition of hate crime and an exploration of resilience to gendered violence amongst former-refugee communities in Australia. She is Executive Editor of *Current Issues in Criminal Justice*, Associate Editor of the *Australian and New Zealand Journal of Criminology* and Series Editor for the *Institute of Criminology Monograph Series*.
